MIZRACHIST LEADER HERE.

Hermann Struck Planning American Propaganda—His Etchings on View.

An exhibition of the works of Herman Struck, the German etcher and painter, opened last week at the gallerles of the Berlin Photographic Company, 305 Madison Avenue, in conjunction with etchings of other contemporaneous German etchers, including Max Liebermann and Slevogt. The exhibition will continue for two weeks.

Mr. Struck is now in the United States, with the idea of making an extensive tour of the castern part of the country. He is also largely interested in the activities of the section of the orthodox Zionists known as the Mizrachists, and he hopes to arouse interest in a number of Palestinian enterprises. Later in his stay he will be the guest of the Judaeans of this city, and he will also deliver an illustrated lecture on Jewish art before the Zionist organization. He will return to Europe on June 6.
